The Moderator of the Uniting Church NSW/ ACT, Rev. Faaimata Havea Hiliau, the Anglican Archbishop of Brisbane, Most Rev. Jeremy Greaves, the President of the NSW Buddhist Council, Gawaine Powell Davies, and (except that an injury kept him away) the Vice-President of the Islamic Council of Victoria, Mohamed Mohideen. It was immensely encouraging to have the

whole-hearted support for such well-respected leaders. On February 26 these leaders met with Ministers Tanya Plibersek and Pat Conroy, the Prime Minister's Chief of Staff, Hon. Ged Kearney and Australia's Climate Ambassador at DFAT, all organised by ARRCC.(Australian Religious Response to Climate Change) ARRCC will be calling on the federal leaders of both major political parties to outline their plan to move away from coal and gas and towards clean energy, and to provide a date by which they will do so. We will also call for an end to public money going towards fossil fuel industries. We will ask both leaders to support a proposed global Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty to phase out fossil fuels and to make a massive historic investment in clean energy that will create jobs in the process. And we will call on them to love our nearest neighbours by getting behind their calls for a fossil fuel free Pacific.
