On 11 -22 November, the UN Climate Change Conference COP 29 kicks off. Delegates from around the world will convene in Baku, Azerbaijan, for two weeks of crucial negotiations, dynamic discussions and global collaboration, all focused on tackling the climate crisis with urgen-

cy and ambition.

A key focus of COP29 will be **on finance**, as trillions of dollars are required for countries to drastically reduce greenhouse gas emissions and protect lives and livelihoods from the worsening impacts of climate change.

Climate change is **changing water availability, making it scarcer in more regions**. Global warming exacerbates water shortages in already water-stressed regions and is leading to an increased risk of agricultural droughts affecting crops, and ecological droughts increasing the vulnerability of ecosystems. 
