Hope25

Easter Day marks the beginning of the intentional season of Hope25 which continues through to Pentecost. During this time we are asked to commit both as individuals and as a Parish in sharing the Hope that we have in Christ Jesus. Throughout our recent Lenten studies we have been exploring how different biblical characters proclaimed the hope they have in God and Jesus and how they encourage us to develop, nourish and proclaim that same hope. St Peter reminds us to, "Always be prepared to give an answer to anyone who asks you to give a reason for the hope that you have; yet do it will gentleness and reverence." As Christians we are call to make Christ known in the world and what better way of doing that than by sharing the hope we have in a world which is desperate for hope. Hope25 encourages each of us to reach out to those around us who are lost amongst the uncertainties, hurt and brokenness of the world. Over the next seven weeks we'll pray for hope, I'll do my best to preach it and let's together demonstrate it through our daily living and interactions with those whom we meet.

FAST FASHION

This year's International Day of Zero Waste emphasizes the need for action in the fashion and textile sector to reduce waste and advance circular solutions. Every year the textile sector produces 2-8 per cent of global greenhouse gas emissions, and it uses 215 trillion litres of water, the equivalent of 86 million Olympic-sized swimming pools. We can reduce environmental harm by adopting practices like reuse, repair, and recycling. Here are some suggestions. Shift away from fast fashion and invest in durable, high-quality clothing, sustainable fashion, second-hand clothing, or other alternatives. Shop wisely. Ask yourself if you think you will wear the item of clothing at least thirty times. If the answer is no, then perhaps you can walk away without it. Wash your clothes less frequently. Use fabric from unwanted clothes for other projects e.g. patchwork, pillow cases, shopping bags, dolls' clothes, toys r pet's beds. Doubling the number of times a garment is worn would reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 44 per cent. Susan Skowronski. Australia Mothers Union
