Environmental impact. Plastic pollution is present everywhere, from the Mariana Trench (deepest ocean point) to Mount Everest (highest mountain peak). An estimated 11 million tonnes of plastics leak into aquatic ecosystems each year. Around 13 million tonnes of plastics accumulate into the soil annually.

Health impact. Plastics break down into microplastics and nano plastics, which can enter the food chain and cause adverse health impacts. Microplastics have been found

in human arteries, lungs, brains—and even in breast milk. Recycling alone is not enough. It is estimated that only 21 per cent of plastic today is economically recyclable, meaning that the value of the recycled material is high enough to cover the cost of collecting, sorting, and processing it. A circular economy for plastics as a way forward. A comprehensive circular economy approach could reduce the volume of plastics entering our ocean by over 80 per cent and save governments US\$70 billion between 2021-2040


