Nicene Creed

Did you know 2025 represents the 1700th anniversary of the writing of the Nicene Creed? First agreed by over 300 bishops convened by Emperor Constantine at the Council of Nicaea (Synod) in AD325, the Creed expresses the church's faith in the Holy Trinity - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Significant beliefs expressed in the Creed include that Jesus rose from the dead and that the apostolic church is one. St Francis College has assembled resources dedicated to helping us think more deeply about what we say in the Creed every Sunday, https://www.stfran.qld.edu.au/franks-news/2025/7/25/issue-61-franks-news-august-2025#mctoc6. Meanwhile Catholic Bishop, Robert Barron, in his Word on Fire podcast dedicates episode 496 (30 June, 2025) to the Nicene Creed and its relevance for contemporary society.
