

AUSTRALASIAN RECYCLING LABEL

The Australasian Recycling Label (ARL) is an evidence-based system for Australia and New Zealand, that provides you with easy to understand recycling information when you need it most. It removes confusion, saves you time and reduces waste going to landfill.

HOW DOES IT WORK? There are three types of label classifications:



Australians and New Zealanders care about the environment and want to do the right thing. But with hundreds of recycling labels out there, getting recycling right can be confusing and even recycling gurus get it wrong. The ARL removes recycling confusion. When we dispose of our waste correctly, we keep contamination out of the recycling stream and recyclable material away from landfill.



CONTAINERS FOR CHANGE

Expanding the container refund scheme From 1 November 2023, the container refund scheme will be expanded to include glass wine and pure spirit bottles. From this date, all glass wine and pure spirit bottles will be eligible for a 10-cent refund when returned to a container refund point in Queensland. Reminder that we still collect containers

with the 10c recycle note on the bottle or can for funds towards our projects account. Please leave these in the marked containers at both churches. *Reminder—please remove lids*
